

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

THE BALSDON FELLOWSHIP THE HUGH LAST FELLOWSHIP 2024-5

Closing date for applications: Monday 11 December 2023.

These fellowships are open to established scholars, normally in post in a UK university.* In addition to pursuing their own research, the fellows are expected to take an interest in the work of other award-holders at the BSR, particularly those in fields close to their own, and to contribute to the BSR's programme during their term of residence with a lecture, workshop, or other appropriate event.

We particularly welcome applications from candidates from groups currently underrepresented at the BSR (including, but not limited to, people from Black, Asian, and other minority ethnic backgrounds).

The **Balsdon Fellowship** is offered for research on any aspect of the social, religious, political, and economic cultures of the Italian peninsula, and their wider textual, visual, and material dissemination and reception from early prehistory to the modern period.

The **Hugh Last Fellowship** is offered for research on classical antiquity (excluding archaeological fieldwork and work on Roman Britain).

 Both fellowships offer board and lodging at the BSR for a three-month period between late September 2024 and June 2025.

Applications must be submitted on https://bsrome.slideroom.com by Monday 11 December 2023.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. These fellowships are intended for established scholars, normally in post in a UK university*.
- 2. Applicants must be British or Commonwealth citizens; or must have studied at postgraduate level in a Higher Education Institution in the UK.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Normally two successive awards for the same project will not be considered.
- 2. Applications must be submitted online, completing the appropriate application forms.
- 3. Residencies will be tenable between late September 2024 and June 2025.
- 4. Family members can normally be accommodated for limited periods by prior agreement, but will be asked to pay for their board and lodging at the BSR's prevailing rates. Applicants with caring responsibilities or special needs should contact the Programmes Manager (Courtney Quaintance, <u>programmes.manager@bsrome.it</u>) to discuss these directly.
- 5. We ask that our award-holders take out medical insurance for the duration of their tenure.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Applications will be assessed using the following criteria:

- 1. The inherent academic significance and interest of the project proposed, and the feasibility of completion to the timetable stated.
- 2. The suitability of the project for the BSR, bearing in mind its location, resources and access to resources.
- 3. The academic merit of the applicant judged by his/her previous record and references, including her/his prospects of making a future contribution to scholarship.
- 4. The suitability of the candidate to contribute to the academic community of the BSR and the need to ensure a reasonable balance between different disciplines and chronological periods within the BSR's academic community.
- 5. The role of the Fellowships, Scholarships and Awards in promoting Italian studies in Britain and the Commonwealth.
