



# GILES WORSLEY ROME FELLOWSHIP 2024–5

Closing date for applications: Monday 11 December 2023

This fellowship is in memory of Giles Worsley, the distinguished architectural historian and critic, who died in 2006 at the age of 44. He was an enthusiastic visitor to Italy and a great believer in the importance of Italian architecture of all periods in understanding the development of Western architecture.

THE GILES WORSLEY ROME FELLOWSHIP is a research award given for the study of architectural history. It is open to architectural historians and architects whose research in the field of architectural or urban history would benefit from the opportunity to spend three months (September-December 2024) at the British School at Rome experiencing the reality of buildings and spaces in and around Rome related to their subject of study.

The research carried out at the BSR may be part of a wider project, but it should be presented at the end of the fellowship as a discrete piece of work. The Giles Worsley Fellow will have access to the extensive collections of the BSR Library and Archive and will join our community of artists and scholars, contributing to and benefitting from the intellectual and social exchange that is a fundamental part of life at the BSR.

## The fellowship offers:

- board and accommodation in a study-bedroom for three months (September-December 2024)
- a monthly research grant of £800

## Applicants must be:

of British or Commonwealth nationality, or have been working professionally or studying at postgraduate level for at least the last three years in the UK or Commonwealth (i.e., since March 2021).

### **SELECTION CRITERIA**

Applications will be assessed using the following criteria:

- 1. the quality of the applicant's creative and/or academic output (judged on the application and references)
- 2. the inherent significance and interest of the project proposed
- 3. the feasibility of the project being undertaken in three months, and being an end in itself, rather than a means to an end
- 4. the suitability of the project for the BSR, bearing in mind its location, resources and access to resources
- 5. the potential for the fellowship to impact on the applicant's professional development and on her/his contribution to architecture and/or architectural history
- 6. the suitability of the applicant to contribute to the academic community of the BSR

### **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- 2. Fellows live at the BSR. Family members can normally be accommodated for limited periods by prior agreement but will be asked to pay for their board and lodging at the BSR's prevailing rates.
