

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS 2024-2025

THE SIMON KEAY AWARD IN MEDITERRANEAN ARCHAEOLOGY

Closing date for applications: Monday 11 December 2023

This award, established in 2021 in memory of Professor Simon Keay, is for research on any aspect of Roman archaeology in the Mediterranean. Applications are welcomed in research areas similar to (but not limited by) those of Professor Keay, including trade, ports, Portus, and ceramic studies.

The award takes one of the following formats:

• Free board and lodging at the BSR for three months, with a monthly research and travel grant of £800.

OR

• Free board and lodging at the BSR for one month, and two months of fieldwork (to be undertaken within a year of the award being made), with a monthly research and travel grant of £800. Fieldwork may include any form of practical work relating to archaeological research not feasible to do from a base in Rome, such as (but not restricted to) the study of material at sites, non-invasive surveys, consultation of archives, and consultation of museum collections.

Applications must be submitted on https://bsrome.slideroom.com by Monday 11 December 2023.

ELIGIBILITY

- The award is open to early career researchers. Applicants may be at post-graduate or post-doctoral level.
- The Award is an open call and is not restricted by nationality, residency, or educational
 affiliation
- Postgraduate applicants normally will have begun a programme of research in the general field
 of the Roman archaeology of the Mediterranean, whether or not registered for a higher degree.
- Post-doctoral applicants normally will be within three years of the award of their doctorate (i.e., awarded no earlier than December 2020).

 Scholars who have submitted an application for a Rome Fellowship, Scholarship or Award for 2024-5 may also apply for the Simon Keay Award, but will need to submit a separate application.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. All applicants must have at least a first degree at the time of application.
- 2. Applications must be submitted through the BSR's grant management platform: https://bsrome.slideroom.com
- 3. The residency period at the BSR will be in the academic year (late September 2024–June 2025).
- 4. Normally two successive BSR awards for the same project will not be considered.
- 5. Family members can normally be accommodated for limited periods by prior agreement but will be asked to pay for their board and lodging at the BSR's prevailing rates.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the awardee to obtain, if required, an appropriate visa and/or rights to live in Italy for the award duration.
- 7. We ask that our award-holders take out medical insurance for the duration of their tenure.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Applications will be assessed using the following criteria:

- 1. The academic merit of the applicant judged by their previous record and references, including their prospects of making a future contribution to scholarship.
- 2. The suitability of the project in line with the research interests, broadly speaking, of Professor Simon Keay.
- 3. The inherent academic significance and interest of the project proposed, and the feasibility of completion to the timetable stated.
