

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

ROBERT ADAM ROME SCHOLARSHIP IN ARCHITECTURE

Closing date for applications: 3 June 2024

THE ROBERT ADAM ROME SCHOLARSHIP IN ARCHITECTURE is awarded to an architect or scholar to study the tradition and evolution of classical architecture in Rome and Italy, which could include associated urban form. The successful candidate will spend three months at the BSR undertaking a self-directed programme of research. This research — related to the city of Rome or elsewhere in Italy — may take the form of research, measurement or drawing, a theoretical study, an historical investigation or a combination of all four, all related to the tradition and evolution of classical architecture. It will include a final report or portfolio that can be published with the specific objective of informing current architectural practice. The award-holder will have access to the extensive collections of the BSR Library and Archive and will join our community of artists and scholars, contributing to and benefitting from the intellectual and social exchange that is a fundamental part of life at the BSR.

The scholarship offers:

- board and accommodation in a study-bedroom
- monthly research and travel grant of £800
- duration: 3 months (January-March OR April-June 2025)

Applicants must be:

SELECTION CRITERIA

All applications will be assessed using the following criteria:

- 1. A written proposal for study, illustrated if appropriate, setting out the detailed subject area, the method of study and the nature and form of the final report. It should be noted that this will be assessed on its academic standards or appropriate methodology and its potential for informing current architectural practice. It is recognised that the proposal will refer to information yet to be gathered in the study but some initial understanding of the subject matter will be necessary and some preliminary investigation is advised.
- 2. A full curriculum vitae giving information on tertiary education, areas of interest, personal details (at your discretion), any publications, awards, special mentions (these are not a necessary requirement). Add any drawings or illustration as appropriate but do not submit a large portfolio.
- 3. At least two personal or academic references from individuals of standing that know you personally and have some knowledge or information of your capacity for study and presentation and your suitability for this scholarship and the communal life of an institution abroad.

Candidates will be expected to have some knowledge of Italian or be willing to learn. Those who acknowledge the importance of communicating with Italians will derive the most benefit from being at the BSR.
